

# CREATING THE RIGHT ATMOSPHERE FOR LEARNING

## C/S AIRFOIL AT THE RED MAIDS' JUNIOR SCHOOL, BRISTOL



### Project Overview

Founded in 1634, Red Maids' School is the oldest surviving girls' school in the country. As part of recent extension works to the Junior school, an atrium was constructed to link two of the older buildings, whilst creating an open plan space for a new main entrance and library.

C/S Airfoil was recommended to Genesis Architects by the main contractors E R Hemmings, who commissioned Par Louvre Systems for the design of the horizontal and vertical facade, supply and installation.

The C/S Airfoil solar shading "is a delightful and attractive addition" to the new building, providing it with just the right balance of natural light; maintaining a light and airy atmosphere whilst preventing glare and heat gain, "making the library a very comfortable place to read"
